## טנהדרין Sanhed<u>rin</u>

Knas - סקנס - A fine that a beit din levies on a person who is not technically liable for punishment.

Malkot מלקות - Also known as "makkot," this is a Torah punishment requiring the flogging of someone who intentionally transgresses a prohibition.

Hoda'a - הודאה When a litigant admits to having done a particular action. A court accepts this admission as legitimate in monetary cases, but rejects it in capital ones, as litigants are unfit to testify against themselves.

**Drisha v'Chakira - ררישה וחקירה** Interrogation - aimed at determining the witnesses' credibility.

Arba Mitot Beit Din - ארבע מיתות בית דין

The four types of capital punishment that the beit din may impose. In light of the severity of the punishment, the conditions for these sentences are extremely difficult to meet.

Skila - סקילה A capital punishment in which the convict is pushed off a cliff. If the impact does not kill the convict, first the witnesses and then the general community stone him/her.

**Sreifa - שריפה** A capital punishment in which the beit din pours melted lead down the convict's throat, burning his/her insides.

Hereg - הרג Also called *sayif* (literally, "sword"), this is the capital punishment of decapitation.

Chenek - كِمَا In this capital punishment, a cloth is wrapped around the convict's neck and one person pulls it from each side.

Hekdesh - הקדש An object dedicated to the Temple, that one may not use for non-sanctified purposes.

Ir haNidachat - נייר הנדחת A deviant city in which most of the inhabitants are idol worshippers.

Ibur Shana - ניבור שנה The formal procedure by which the beit din adds a month to the Hebrew calendar to create a leap year.
